

SHAVUOS SCHEDULE CHABAD OF TARZANA

Thursday Night, May 25th - First Night of Shavuos

Eruv Tavshilin: pg. 327 (In order to cook on the Holiday for Shabbat) An Eruv Tavshilin is a halachic device which allows one to cook food on the Festival for use on the Shabbat that immediately follows. This eruv consists of a whole challah or matzah and something cooked, for example, a boiled egg or a piece of fish, and is prepared before the onset of the Festival.)

Take a plate with one whole challah or matzah and either a piece of cooked fish, cooked meat or a hard-boiled egg on it, Recite the following blessing: *BA-RUCHA-TAH ADO-NAI E-LO-HE-NU ME-LECH HA-OLAM ASHER KID-E-SHA-NU BE-MITZ-VO-TAV VETZI-VA-NU AL MITZVAT ERUV.*

Then recite: "*By virtue of this Eruv, we (the members of this household), shall be permitted to cook, bake, keep food warm, carry, light candles and do all preparations on Yom Tov for Shabbat.*"

Put the foods you used for the Eruv away, and eat them on Shabbat

All Night Learning 11:30 pm – On the night before the Torah was given the Jewish people went to sleep.

Though many lofty explanations are given as to why, we none the less have a need to rectify that act which we do by staying awake all night until dawn, immersed in the study of Torah. Some have the custom to recite Tikkun Leil Shavuos which consists of excerpts from every Parsha of the Torah, every book of the Neviim (The Prophets), and the Kesuvim (The Sacred Writings) as well as every tractate of the Mishna, Maimonides list of the 613 commandments and excerpts from Kabblah.
